ORDINANCE NO. 89 - 8 TOWNSHIP OF HILLTOWN, BUCKS COUNTY PENNSYLVANIA

AN ORDINANCE REDUCING THE SPEED OF MOTOR VEHICLES ON BLOOMING GLEN ROAD FROM ITS INTERSECTION WITH OLD BETHLEHEM ROAD NORTHWARD TO THE HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP-EAST ROCKHILL TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY

THE HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, upon recommendation of the Hilltown Township Police Department which has observed traffic patterns on the Blooming Glen Road, a portion of which was formerly called State Street, within Hilltown Township, Bucks County, Pennsylvania; and pursuant to appropriate engineering, traffic studies and investigation, hereby enacts and ordains as follows:

SECTION I

Words and phrases when used in this Ordinance shall have the meaning described to them in the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code, 1976, June 17, P.L. 162, Act Number 81, as amended. (75 P.S. 1000 et seq., as now enforced or hereafter amended).

SECTION II

The operation of any motor vehicle in excess of forty-five (45) miles per hour on Blooming Glen Road in Hilltown Township from its intersection with Old Bethlehem Road northward to its intersection with the East Rockhill Township-Hilltown Township boundary line is hereby prohibited.

SECTION III

The proper authorities of the Township are directed to erect official signs reducing the speed on the aforesaid Blooming Glen Road from fifty-five (55) miles per hour to forty-five (45) miles per hour, and to do so in conformity with the provisions of the Vehicle Code.

SECTION IV

Any person violating the maximum speed limit as set forth herein shall be prosecuted under the Vehicle Code, and shall be subject to the fines and penalties therein set forth.

SECTION V

All Ordinances, parts or Ordinances, and amendments thereof are repealed insofar as they are inconsistent with the foregoing Ordinance.

SECTION VI

This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days after final enactment.
