

Hilltown Township Supervisors' Meeting

June 11, 1979

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman Vince Pischl. The treasurer's report was read by Mrs. Gutekunst and approved by Feryl Spanninger and seconded by Ed Wentz. The bills as presented in the amount of \$4643.72 were approved for payment by Feryl Spanninger and seconded by Ed Wentz.

The minutes of the previous meeting were reviewed. Mr. Wilson reported he had been unable to arrange for representatives of Brookfield Village to be at last night's meeting so a tentative date of July 30th will be tried for. The supervisors moved to have the meetings in July on July 9th and July 30th because of conflicts on July 23rd. Mrs. Gutekunst will advertise this change. Minutes were approved.

The neighbors of Mrs. Ammon were at the meeting to hear what progress if any had been made on correcting the situation on Mrs. Ammon's property. Mr. Wilson reported that he and Mr. Hoot had been out to the property on Friday, June 8th and Mrs. Ammon has already complied with some of the suggestions made to her by Mr. Hoot and the Dept. of Agriculture. She indicates that she will continue to try and comply with these suggestions- a cement slab will have to be placed under the new trailer, she has already had stone hauled in and improved the driveway. Mr. Wilson felt if the Dept. of Agriculture will make their periodic inspections, Mr. Hoot checks on her, and our police dept. checks on her the situation should improve. Mrs. Phillips questioned what could be done by the old abandoned house on the property which sits near the road- she and the other neighbors feel it is a hazard for children. This will be checked into.

Mr. Wentz reported he had received a revised plan of study for the proposed sewage facilities done for Hatfield Boro and Montgomery Township. He questioned the wording in section 201 where the Hilltown portion was described as that portion on the west side of Hilltown Pike that runs from Route 309 to Township Line Road. It was felt that should include only the properties fronting on Hilltown Pike. Mrs. Gutekunst will write to Roy Love indicating we would like that wording changed.

Mr. Spanninger announced the resignation of Walter Rubel from the Planning Commission. A motion was made and passed unanimously to accept his resignation and send him a letter thanking him for his services rendered to the township.

Mr. Yaglinski of Carroll Engineering Firm representing Acme Markets located in Hilltown Plaza told the supervisors that Acme is still interested in pursuing the installation of a traffic light at the entrance of the shopping center. He was advised to work with PennDot, our engineer, and Chief Boose and when preliminary plans are ready to present them to the supervisors.

A brief discussion again on the free newspapers that are thrown into driveways, etc by the Free Press was held. People should get in touch with the circulation manager and also fill out the coupon in the paper with their name and address that they do not want the paper.
