

Hilltown Township Supervisors Meeting

September 27, 1976

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Dale Hartshorne. The treasurer's report was read by Mrs. Gutekunst and approved by Feryl Spanniger and seconded by Vincent Pischl. The bills as presented were approved for payment by Feryl Spanniger and seconded by Vincent Pischl.

The following dates of future meetings were announced; Police Arbitration Meeting- October 4th, Horn Hearing-Batch Plant October 6th, Road Inspection- October 23rd, 9:00 A.M., Hearing-H. & K. - November 17th.

The dump truck has been ordered and construction on the police department building is expected to be started in about two weeks.

Mr. Heidrich reported that water has been discovered in the oil tank which supplies the municipal building and the police building. Probably a new tank will have to be installed.

Question raised by Mr. Spanniger on the progress being made on the contaminated well situation. Mr. Wilson reported that he had called Mr. Coyne on Sept. 17th, he wasn't in and did not return Mr. Wilson's call so Mr. Wilson called him again on Sept. 27th. Mr. Coyne said nothing had been done by him because the geologists have not reported back to him. After discussion, it was decided that Mr. Wilson should write letters to Senator Howard, Representative Weidner, Governor Shapp, explaining the problem so that we can get some action to clear up the situation. Mr. Heidrich had talked to Paul Yanika, who reported that Mr. Horn has not been cooperating and a possibility would be for the state to go in and do the work of draining the quarry and billing Mr. Horn for the work.

Mr. Wilson reported that Joel Benner has been held up on his proposal to add additional acreage to his present grounds because of a problem in getting title clearance. As soon as possible Mr. Grim will get a letter in to the supervisors.

Mr. Pischl has been in contact with the county on what projects could be submitted in our application for the Hud money in the amount of \$77,000.00. One possibility discussed would be the storm sewers in the Blooming Glen area. It seems the main concern is that our project benefit low-income or blighted areas. Mr. Hartshorne said he would attend a meeting on Oct. 21st on this subject.

Mr. Morris Stout of Sun Oil Co. was into the meeting, asking permission to install a self-service island at their station located at 309 and Hilltown Pike. Permission granted.

The minutes of the previous ^{meeting} were approved by Vincent Pischl and seconded by Dale Hartshorne.

The contracts for building the police addition were signed by Dale Hartshorne- Contract 1- General Construction-Walter Brucker & Co., Inc., Contract 4- C. & C. Mechanical Contractors, Inc.

A check was received in the amount of \$869.57 to cover materials and labor cost for repairing the bridge on Reliance Road from Nationwide Insurance Co.

A discussion was held on Mr. Wilson's letter re: Recent Legislation which permits the township to require purchasers to give a Certification of Zoning. One avenue of thought that this could be accomplished through title companies being made aware of this requirement. Mr. Wilson will pursue.

Brief discussion on the high engineering costs of the architect from Cowan on the police addition. Mr. Hartshorne will talk to Mr. Leister about the inspections on the new addition as work progresses.

Reminder was made about the Hilltown Township Bi-Cen Sunday on October 3rd. Mr. Spanniger said he would not be able to attend.
