Hillt wn Township Supervisors Meeting

## December 29, 1975

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Dale Hartshorne. The treasurer's report was read by Mrs. Gutekunst and approved by Feryl Spanninger and seconded by Paul Frankenfield. The bills as presented were approved for payment by Feryl Spanninger and seconded by Paul Frankenfield. One correction was made to the minutes of the previous meeting, in the sixth paragraph-letter received from Mr. Petersen of Betz Environmental Engineers, Inc. instead of the Bucks Co. Bank Trust Dept.

The budget of Hilltown Township General Fund for 1976 was adopted. Paul Frankenfield made the motion for adoption and it was seconded by Feryl Spanninger. The total amount of the budget being \$460,533.68.

Mr. Hartshorne had written a letter about the contamination of the wells and also a letter to Mrs. Hughes about the recreation program in the area. Both letters were given to Mrs. Gutekunst for typing and sending.

The reorganizational meeting of the supervisors will be held on January 5, 1975, 7:30 P.M. January 7th a public meeting will be held by the Hilltown Township Sewer Authority to present the sewer program to the public.

The supervisors signed the subdivision plans of Albert Slingluff and Mary Pace Townsley.

Mr. Wilson is working on the quarry ordinance and also is to begin work on a rifle ordinance.

Mrs. Gutekunst reported on a letter received from the Bureau of Census. We are to provide them with a office and also advertise for people to take the census. They probably will be ready to begin January 22nd. Mrs. Gutekunst was instructed to put advertisements in the Daily Intelligencer, News-Herald and the North Penn Reporter.

Both Dale Hartshorne and Feryl Spanninger thanked Paul Frankenfield for his eighteen years of service as a supervisor in Hilltown Township. This was Paul's last meeting as a supervisor but he will continue on as road supervisor.

The police reports for September and October were read by Mrs. Gutekunst. These reports brought forth some discussion about dangerous intersections. One discussed was at the intersection of Diamond Street and Route 113. Possibility of a traffic light here was mentioned.

A resolution was adopted authorizing the borrowing of an additional \$4000.00 from the Bucks County Bank & Trust Co. for the Hilltown Township Sewer Authority to pay additional bills and the interest due so far on the first borrowing.
