Mr. Hartshorne reported he had received a phone call from Mr. Thomas Salvadore of the Bucks County Health Dept. in response to the letter written by Mr. Hartshorne to Mr. Salvadore. The problem of the contaminated wells has been turned over to a Mr. Al Wells of Nashaminy Manor Court. A detailed study will be conducted on this matter.

Feryl Spanninger read a letter received by the supervisors from Penn Dot denying the request to have the remedial strip re-moved on Route 113 at Hilltown Plaza. There were quite a few residents of that area present at the meeting. Mr. John Konyk, owner of the shoe store on Route 113, presented a copy of a tele-gram he sent to Governor Shapp concerning this problem. Mrs. Gutekunst was instructed to call Kimco Corp. of Roselyn, N.Y. asking for a meeting between their engineer and interested parties. Chief Boose should also have available the number of accidents re-ported in that area since this remedial strip was installed by the state.
