

MINUTES

The meeting of the Hilltown Township Supervisors was held this 6th day of December, 1973, at the Municipal Building, Blooming Glen, Pa.

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 P.M. by the Chairman, Mr. Frankenfield, with all Supervisors present.

The meeting opened with the reading of the minutes of the meeting held November 17, 1973. A motion to accept the minutes as read was made by Mr. Hartshorne, seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

The bills were reviewed and ordered paid on a motion by Mr. Hartshorne, seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

This resolution passed on a motion by Mr. Hartshorne and seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

A motion was made to approve a resolution to release \$300 balance on a bond posted for the Paul R. Alderfer sanitary landfill, a motion was made to approve, by Mr. Hartshorne and seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

Mrs. Helen Shearer presented her resignation as secretary to the Zoning Hearing board, the resignation was accepted with regret.

The Supervisors signed the final subdivision for Woodroffe, Anna Balco, J. R. Fretz, 13 lots, and Joel Benner, 55 units.

A letter was read from the Dept. of Transportation, date of Nov. 30, 1973, approving final distribution of actual costs of \$47,563.34 for construction.

Also from the Dept. of Transportation, a letter was read, date of Nov. 30, 1973, notifying the County Commissioners that it was satisfactory to pay the township their County Aid request for \$2,088.04.

A notice from Zoning Hearing Board was read of a public hearing to be held Dec. 10, 1973, at 7:30 P.M., application of John J. Connally, 4 Conlin Way, Hilltown, to permit a storage shed that does not comply with the zoning ordinance.

A letter was read from Charles S. Wilson Esquire dated Nov. 13, 1973, to the Supervisors stating that the suit, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, legal aid, vs County of Bucks and Municipalities has been appealed to Supreme Court of the U. S.

A copy of a letter was read from Mr. Wilson, dated Nov. 21, 1973, to George Willner Esquire, stating that the township has no flood plain ordinance. We do have flood plain ordinance in subdivision regulation and a flood plain resolution and map.

A letter was read dated Nov. 14, 1973, from Donald B. Smith Associates, Victor Jaczun Esquire, that he forwarded electrical inspection cards to the township.

A letter was read dated Dec. 3, 1973, from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Dept. of Environmental Resources, that they have received the schedule of compliance that provides for March 1, 1974 submission of program, rather than the December 1, 1973 date; this also applies to the Montgomery County program for the Neshaminy Sewerage District.

A letter from R. S. Cowan Associates Inc., township engineers, dated Dec. 4, 1973, notifying us that 1973 accumulative supplements were now available for the basic plumbing code; the secretary is to order seven copies.

A letter was read from Weber and Abarbanel, Dec. 4, 1973, to the Supervisors, than an application to the Public Utility Commission was being made by the Seidel Water Company, Silverdale, Pa., for a total service area containing 3.658 square miles in Hilltown Township.

Mr. Frankenfield objected to this application, he stated it was to be only a four inch line. Solicitor Wilson <sup>was</sup> instructed to study this request.

A motion was made to hire Mr. Arthur L. Heidrich to assist the building inspector, to become effective Dec. 13, 1973, the motion was made by Mr. Hartshorne and seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

There being no further business, a motion was made to adjourn, this being presented by Mr. Hartshorne and seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

The meeting adjourned at 9:45 P.M.
