

MINUTES

The meeting of the Hilltown Township Supervisors was held Oct. 4, 1973, at the Municipal Building, Blooming Glen, Pa., called to order at 7:30 P.M. by the Chairman, Mr. Paul Frankenfield, with Mr. Hartshorne present, Mr. Charles S. Wilson, Solicitor, and Mrs. Doris Miller substituting in the absence of Mr. J. Arthur Moyer, Secretary.

Mr. Frankenfield requested the reading of the minutes of the Sept. 15<sup>th</sup> meeting, and the Treasurer's Report. The minutes and Treasurer's Report were approved on a motion by Mr. Hartshorne, being seconded by Mr. Frankenfield, with the corrections noted as follows:

1. Mr. John Haines presence at the Sept. 15<sup>th</sup> meeting along with other representatives for the Haines and Kibblehouse request for an asphalt plant.
2. Signifying "Main Assembly Room" as the location for the proposed loudspeaker system.
3. Correcting the attendance at the Upper Neshaminy Region #1 Group Sewage Facilities meeting in Lansdale to read, Mr. Hartshorne only.

The current bills were reviewed and ordered paid on a motion by Mr. Hartshorne, with Mr. Frankenfield seconding.

Mr. Hartshorne read and explained the Resolution No. 73-12 in which the Supervisors of Hilltown Township agree to participate in a regionalization program for sewage facilities in Sub-Region I, of the Upper Neshaminy Basin, with the other municipalities and request that the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners act as our designated agency for coordination with the municipalities in Sub-Region I, with the Pa. Dept. of Environmental Resources; following the reading of same, he and Mr. Frankenfield signed same.

Mr. Hartshorne and Mr. Frankenfield also signed a Resolution designating Mr. Moyer as the authorized official to act on behalf of the township for the application to the appropriate state office for purpose of obtaining certain Federal Financial Assistance under the Disaster Relief Act; our township application to be in the amount of \$7,684.40. *for flood damage*

The Secretary is to reply in the affirmative to the request of the Montgomery County Planning Commission that the firm of Betz Environmental Engineers be designated to supply the necessary technical background to select a sewage facilities plan and management program for Sub-Region I.

Subdivision plans were signed as follows:

1. Joseph B. Assal, Township Line Rd., combining two lots into one lot.
2. Olivia Eckhardt, Telegraph Rd., one lot.
3. Morgan Wolfrom, Redwing Rd., one lot.

Chief Boose was asked to explain his reporting of vandalism to the gymnasium annex at the rear of the police department building. He stated there have been windows broken (from the outside), screening pulled loose at windows and above the ceiling of the police department, which encloses a storage area, and trash containers scattered inside the building, and stored desks damaged. Mr. Hartshorne stated he feels the message should be passed through the channels of those privileged to use the facilities, that these privileges could just as easily be removed. He also suggested a program in which someone might volunteer to act as an overseer one night a week to prevent such acts. It was decided a decision cannot be made hurriedly, and further discussion will take place.

A letter which had been written by the Township Secretary to Mr. Mininger, Zoning Officer, was read; it advised Mr. Mininger to abstain from issuing further building permits to the Green Meadows Development. There were questions from the floor as to the owner of this property, and Robert Baesman was found to be the parent owner. Mr. Wilson will do some further checking into this situation.

Letters were received and reviewed from the Penna. Dept. of Transportation, Mr. J. R. Doughty, P.E., in reference to the erection of traffic signals at the locations of:

1. Blooming Glen Rd., Old Bethlehem Rd. and Hayhouse Rd. Survey results, not justified after evaluation.
2. Dublin Pike, (Route 313) and Broad St., not justified after evaluation.
3. Route 113 and Callowhill Rd.; not justified as to traffic signal, but it would be agreeable with them, upon proper application and acceptance of design, to issue a permit for the erection of Flashing Beacons at this location.

Chief Boose explained situations at this intersection involving vehicles route of travel, etc., in which accident occur. Mr. Heidrich mentioned the fence at the property on the northeast corner of the intersection, which he feels is a cause for concern to those traveling south on Callowhill. Mr. Gubelman asked if there would be a possibility of approaching the problem from the standpoint of it being a "common nuisance." The distance of right of way for this state highway was discussed, with Mr. Wilson advising it to be 30 ft. The secretary is to write a reply to this particular letter regarding this intersection, suggesting the property owner be approached and requested to pull the designated fence back.

Mr. Hartshorne read a notice from Joseph Synkonis, Jr. P.E., also of the Pa. Dept. of Transportation, that a semi-final inspection is to be made on Oct. 10, 1973, at 10:30 A.M. of the new bridge construction on Callowhill Rd., south of Route 113.

Mr. Heidrich also reported he has been in touch with the Penna. Dept. of Transportation once again with reference to continueing flooding and washing conditions at E. Creamery Rd. and Callowhill Rd.

The township has received the amount of \$1918 from the Comm. of Pa. from the Public Utilities Realty Tax.

We have issued a check to the Line Lexington Fireman's Relief Fund in the amount of \$2183.02, these funds being received by the township from the Comm. of Pa. Foreign Fire Insurance allocation.

A portion of the resignation of Joseph C. Trevethan was read by Mr. Hartshorne, it being from the Hilltown Township Police Dept. as a patrolman.

Mrs. J. L. Long, a resident of Hillcrest Road, stated she and other residents in the area of Hillcrest and Orchard Roads have approached the Pennridge Transportation Coordinator, Mr. Wm. Gallagher, to no avail, for their request that a second bus stop be designated for this area, as 17 children get on at this corner. They were advised by Mr. Gallagher that a second stop being set up hinged upon the permission by the township to erect a shelter at said stop. Mr. Hartshorne suggested she contact Mrs. Louise Wismer of the Citizen's Advisory Board, for any possible aid she might be able to provide to correct this situation.

There being no further business, Mr. Frankenfield entertained a motion for adjournment, at 8:50 P.M., said motion being made by Mr. Hartshorne, and seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

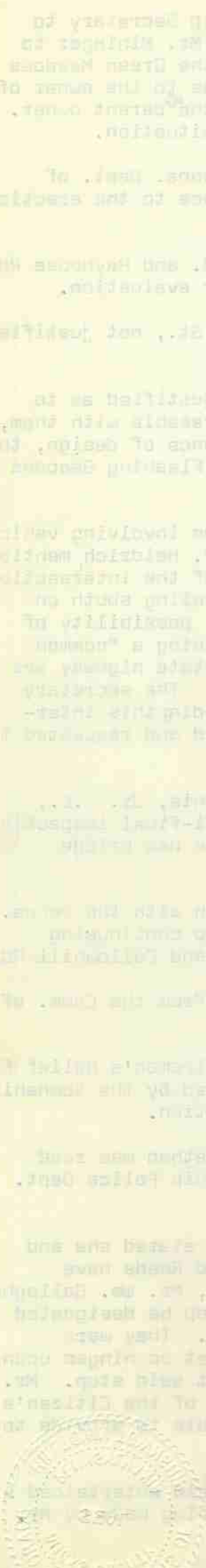
