The meeting of the Hilltown Township Supervisors was held this 19th day of August 1972, at the Township Building, Route 113 and Diamond St., Silverdale, Pa.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Mr. Frankenfield at 9:00 a.m., with all Supervisors present.

The meeting opened with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting held Aug. 3, 1972. A motion was made by Mr. Hartshorns to accept the minutes as read, with the change noted, instead of the word "suggested", the word "motion". The motion was then seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

The bills were reviewed and ordered paid on a motion by Mr. Harsshorne, seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

Visitors present were Mr.Gubelman, Mr. Atler, Mr. Browning, Mr. Redding, Mr. Painter, Mr. Bishop, Mr. Meld, Mr. Neachochea, Mr. & Mrs. Hamilton, Mrs. Rothstein, Mr. Boose and Mr. Thomas.

Reporters present were Vivian Paul, Free Press; Mr. Cressman, Call-Chronicle; Mr. Mitchell, North Penn Reporter.

Cease and Desist orders were mailed by our Zoning Officer, Mr. Edward Mininger, to the following: Kathleen Bouser, in violation of Article XI, Section 1119; Joel Benner, Article III, Section 301; Richard S. Collins, Article XIII, of the Hilltown Township Zoning Ordinance.

We received a letter from our solicitor concerning the new Planning regulations amendments Act 93, to Act 247.

A notice from James W. Miller, to inform us that he will do our police pension fund audit in September; we will be notified as to time and date.

A letter from the Chalfont Borough Council Secretary, Beatrice M. Barr, that a second meeting has been scheduled with officials of municipalities in the Chalfont Fire Company prime protection area. We were invited to attend.

Mr. Hartshorne suggested that the secretary write to our Supervisor's Association for information on what other Second Class Townships are contributing to Volunteer Fire Companies.

The Supervisors agreed to sign a resolution favoring the Pennridge Open Space and Recreational Program, this motion made by Mr. Hartshorne and seconded by Mr. Frankenfield.

The Supervisors are to meet with the Department of Environmental Resources, 1675 New Hope Street, and Lapp and Alderfer, to state why the proposed treatment plant on the Lapp & Alderfer subdivision could not be included in our comprehensive sewering plan. We are to amend our plan to include this treatment plant, and construct an interceptor to this interim plant. Mr. Hartshorne insisted we invite cour Township Engineer to the meeting. Mr. Moyer did not think it necessary.

Members of the Deep Run Jaycees were present and stated their aims are to study community problems. They also mentioned, at some time, if the Supervisors approved, they would paint the inside of the gym building if the Supervisors pupplied the paint.

We Supervisors are agreed to share some of the costs with Silverdale and East Rockhill, for the Regional committee meetings.

Mr. & Mrs. Hamilton, residents of Diamond Street, questioned that the trailer was allowed on the property of Robert Parker. He may have a trailer on his land for a period of two years until his new home is constructed, then it is to be removed.

Mrs. Rosalie Rothstein, a resident of Keystone Brive, on the Joel Benner tract, asked if the shoulder of the road could be paved. After a discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Moyer that the Road-master grade and add dust oil, the motion seconded by Mr. Hartshorne.

Mr. Neachochea questioned why we would not issue him a building permit; his road improvements are not according to subdivision regulations.

A Subdivision plan was signed for David Kinsey, two lots, for 9.12 acres, on Pheasanthill Rd.

The Supervisors made Flood Plain application to the Department of Community Affairs. Mr. Thomas, the Director, asked to have a Plain map of Hilltown Township and would mail us a one page resolution to sign.

The Supervisors agreed to invest \$5,000 in a Savings Certificate for the Police Pension Fund. This money is from our allocation on tax on Foreign Car Insurance.

We received an audit report on the Line Lexington Fireman's Relief Association.

Chalfont Borough has invited us to attend a meeting with other officials of surrounding communities and the Chalfont Volunteer Fire Co., August 29, 1972.

A letter from Eastburn and Gray, Edwin Angstadt, Jr., states that Mr. & Mrs. Wagner are willing to set up an escrow fund for the maintenance of the Morris Run Bridge.

Our solicitors, Smith and Wilson, have informed us that in the case of Hilltown vs. Mager, the Commonwealth Court has affirmed the decision of the Court of Common Pleas of Bucks County, in all of the injunction proceedings.

There being no further business, a motion for adjournment was made by Mr. Hartshorne, and seconded by Mr. Frankenfield. The meeting adjourned at 1:00 P.M.
