## MINUTES

The meeting of the Hilltown Township Supervisors was held this July 6, 1972, at the Township Suilding, Route 113 and Diamond St., Silverdale, Pa.

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 F.M., by the Chairman, with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting held June 17, 1572. A motion was made by Mr. Frankenfield to accept the minutes as read, and seconded by Mr. Moyer.

The bills were reviewed and ordered paid on a motion by Mr. Frankenfield, seconded by Mr. Moyer.

Those present were, Mr. Gubelman, Mr. Grabowski, Mr. Zoose, Mr. Mininger, Mr. & Mrs. Wagner, Mr. Angstadt, and reporters, Gail Roland, Free Press, Mr. Cressman, Call-Chronicle, Mr. Mitchell, North Penn Reporter, and Jean Fassoldt, Intelligencer.

The Supervisors signed Fire Protection Contracts with Silverdale Fire Co., \$1500, Perkasie Fire Co., \$1,000, Sellersville Fire Co., \$1,000, and our contribution to the Line Lexington Fire Co., \$1,000.

We signed subdivision plans for J. Richard Fretz, three lots on Quarry Rd., and two lots on Route 313.

A resolution was presented, No. 72-8, "Le it resolved, by the Loard of Supervisors of Hilltown Township, that we adopt a fee schedule for multi-family and townhouses:

Apartments: w/ 1 bedroom \$60.00 per unit w/2 bedrooms 70.00 per unit

Townhouses w/2 bedrooms 78.00 w/3 bedrooms 88.09

So resolved this 6th day of July 1972, Moard of Supervisors, Hilltown Township.

The secretary was instructed to inform Hess & Good to have the necessary papers for the township, so that we may proceed with the dedication of Erogress Drive, to Hilltown Township.

A letter was read from the Dept. of Transportation, local participation in the National Highway Safety Program. We are to contact Mr. Joseph Synkonis, District Engineer, for information in preparing application for federal funds for highway safety, and also, by phone, call Mr. Seiboth, £87-1£88.

A letter from the Legal Aid Society requesting we file an appeal on behalf of poor persons to the Zoning Hearing Board contesting the validity of present zoning practises.

The Books County Civil Defens notified us that Bucks County is not a disaster area, but we have since been so designated.

Mr. Angstaët, attorney for Mr. & Mrs. Herman Wagner, gave a resume of the agreements they would like the Supervisors to sign that they may retain the Morris Run Wridge at the present site. The Supervisors agreed that they will have their solicitor review the agreements. Mr. Graboski, our solicitor, voiced objections to the contract, Mrs. Yoder's involvement and lack of guaranteed maintenance.

Ahrens and Tagur brought in their plans for the Supervisors approval and review by our engineer.

There being no further business, on a motion by Mr. Frankenfield, seconded by Mr. Moyer, that we adjourn, the meeting was adjourned at 9:45 P.M.
