

HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS, HELD A SPECIAL MEETING ON FEBRUARY 1, 1972. AT THE TOWNSHIP BUILDING, ROUTE II3, SILVERDALE, PA. WITH ALL SUPERVISORS PRESENT. MR FRANKENFIELD , ME HARTSHORNE, MR, MOYER.

MR. FRANKENFIELD CALLED THE MEETING TO ORDER, AT 7.30 O'CLOCK P.M. MEETING OPENED WITH REMARKS BY THE CHAIRMAN, MR, FRANKENFIELD, THAT WE HAD BEEN TALKING ABOUT SEWERS SINCE 1967. ACT 537 . SIGNED JANUARY 34, 1966 AND TO TAKE EFFECT JULY 1, 1967. AND ALL MUNICIPALITIES WERE TO SUBMIT PLANS TO THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT. UNDER ACT 537. THE NECESSARY STUDIES HAVE BEEN MADE WE HAVE BEEN CITED BY THE BUCKS COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH , AND THE PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES, TO CORRECT SEWAGE PROBLEMS IN AREAS WHERE THEIR ARE MALFUNCTIONING ON SITE SEPTIC SYSTEMS.

THE MEETING WAS THEN TURNED OVER TO MR. HARTSHORNE , WHO STATED THAT THE MEETING WAS CALLED PRIMARILY TO GET THE FEELINGS OF THE RESIDENTS OF BLOOMING GLEN , REGION 2. SECTION A. AND B. DIAMOND ST & ORCHARD ROAD.

MR HARTSHORN STATED THAT THE COST OF THE FRONT FOOT ASSESSMENT WERE STATED AT \$10.00 FRONT FOOT AND THAT IT MIGHT BE \$ 12.00 A FOOT. ALSO THE YEARLY COST TO THE HOME OWNER AT \$158.00 WITH FEDERAL GRANT COULD GO AS HIGH AS \$203.00 A YEAR WITHOUT THE FEDERAL GRANT. AND CONNECTION FEES COULD COST \$100.00 AND LATERALS TO THE STREET \$375.00 AND IF YOU HAD 75 FEET FRONTAGE IT \$12.00 A FOOT WOULD EQUAL \$900.00 FOR A TOTAL COST OF \$1375.00 . AND IF PAID OVER A PERIOD A YAERLY COST FOR 5 YEARS OF \$300. PER YEAR.
