

MEETING OF THE HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS, WAS HELD THIS 16TH DAY OF OCTOBER 1971, AT THE TOWNSHIP BUILDING, LOCATED ON ROUTE 113 & DIAMOND STREET, SILVERDALE PA.

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER BY THE CHAIRMAN AT 9. O'CLOCK A.M. MEETING OPENED WITH THE READING OF THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD OCTOBER 1, 1971.

A MOTION BY MR. FRANKENFIELD TO ACCEPT MINUTES AS READ. MOTION SECONDED BY MR. HOCKMAN.

A MOTION BY MR. FRANKENFIELD TO PAY ALL BILLS. MOTION SECONDED BY MR. HOCKMAN. IN ATTENDANCE WERE A GROUP OF EMPLOYEE'S OF YODER QUARRY, VERNON HORN OWNER. PAUL ESSER KEN ROBERTS, GENE WENHOLD, EDWARD HORN, MIKE BERGER, GALEN RUSH, JOSEPH COOKE, SAMUEL LANDIS, HAROLD CONRAD, RAYMOND COXAND KEN FRENCH OTHERS PRESENT MR. WEBER, MR& MRS DOUGHERTY, MR BROWNING, MR. GUBELMAN, MR WAITE, MR. SPANNINGER, MR. SENSINGER, MR. HARTSHORNE AND MR. BISHOP. REPORTERS LORRAINE CAMPBELL, INTELLIGENCE, MR. CRESSMAN, JOURNAL CHRONICLE, JUNE WHITE QUAKERTOWN FREE PRESS AND MR. MITCHELL, NORTH PENN REPORTER.

MR. FRENCH READ A LETTER TO THE SUPERVISORS, THAT WE DO NOT CONTINUE OUR SUIT AGAINST MR. HORN, THE QUARRY OWNER IF THE QUARRY WOULD BE CLOSED THEY WOULD HAVE NO EMPLOYMENT.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS STATED THAT THERE SUIT IS AGAINST MR. HORN, WAS THAT HE DID NOT APPLY FOR A VARIANCE OR PERMIT WHICH IS AGAINST THE ZONING ORDINANCE, MR. HORN HAS BEEN ORDERED BY JUDGE LUWID TO APPLY FOR A VARIANCE HEARING, BEFORE THE ZONING HEARING BOARD, AND IF THIS SHOULD NOT BE GRANTED. THE HE HAS RECOURSE AT THE COUNTY COURTS THE SECRETARY READ A LETTER FROM MR VIRNELSON, THAT OTHERS WERE IN ~~HILLTOWN~~ TOWNSHIP GUILTY OF POLLUTION, AND THAT THEIR SHOULD BE SPECIFIC STANDARDS FOR BOTH PRIVATE AND COMMERCIAL.

MRS KDOUGER, STATED THAT THAT THIS SHOULD NOT BE BROUGHT AT THIS TIME AS IT WAS POLITICAL, JUST BEFORE ELECTION, THE SUPERVISORS STATED THAT MR. HORN WAS ISSUED A CEASE AND DESIST APRIL 14, 1971.

MR WEBER AND MR. HARTSHORNE URGED THE SUPERVISORS, THAT THE QUARRY REMAIN CLOSED.

MRS DOUGHERTY STATED THAT SHE HAD PROTESTED ABOUT THEODOR FROM THE HORN QUARRY.

MR THOMAS, ~~WREXXMAX~~ MADE AN URGENT APPEAL THAT THE QUARRY REMAIN IN OPERATION, AND THAT THEIR WAS NO SMOKE OR DUST OR ADOR, NOTICEABLE.

MR THOMAS WAS CONCERNED ABOUT THE PERCOLATION TESTS AND DRAINAGE PROBLEMS ON LONG VIEW ACRES. AND IF THE SUPERVISORS COULD DO ANY THING TO IMPROVE THIS CONDITION.

MR. HARTSHORNE, STATED THAT HE THOUGHT NO MORE BUILDING PERMITS BE ISSUED. THE BUCKS COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT ISSUE THE PERMIT FOR ON LOT WATER & SEWAGE, ONLY THEN DOES OUR ZONING OFFICER ISSUE A BUILDING PERMIT. HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP HAS NO HEALTH DEPARTMENT, THE ISSUANCE OF WATER AND SEWER PERMITS ARE ENTIRELY WITHIN THE PROVINCE OF THE BUCKS COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

THE PLANS OF LONGVIEW ACRES ARE RECORDED AND APPROVED BY THE BUCKS COUNTY PLANNING THE HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP PLANNING COMMISSION, THE HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP BOARD OF ~~WREXXMAX~~ SUPERVISORS, THE STATEMENT OF APPROVAL READS CONSIDERED SUITABLE FOR ON LOT WATER & SEWER.

MENTION OF THE DRAINAGE OF PLAN OF LONGVIEW, THE SUPERVISORS HAVE NO JURISDICTION AS WE HAVE NO AGREEMENT FOR ROAD ~~WREXXMAX~~ DRAINAGE.

A MR. RUSH STATED THAT THAT THE PEOPLE, WHO INSTIGATE THE SUITS BY THE TOWNSHIP, SHOULD BE MADE TO PAY THE COSTS.

MR. DOUGHERTY STATED THAT THIS WAS A LEGAL PROCESS OF LAW. MR LANDIS STATED THAT THE BLACK TOP PLANT WAS IN EXISTENCE SINCE 1908, AND THAT THIS WAS AN AMOSITS PLANT. MR KELLER. SUGGESTION TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, THAT WE SHOULD HAVE OUR PLUMBING INSPECTOR, TO INSPECT THE SEWER LINES, IN ADDITION TO OUR TOWNSHIP ENGINEER, SO THAT WE WOULD NOT HAVE INFILTRATION IN THE SEWER LINES AS SOME OF OUR NEIGHBORING COMMUNITIES.

WE WERE NOTIFIED BY THE BUCKS COUNTY BOARD OF ASSESSMENT, MR. RAYMOND VASSETT EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

REAL ESTATE VALUATION \$11,382.020.00, OCCUPATION VALUATION \$701,800.00 TAXABLES 3,369.

A RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED, RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP, CHARGE A FEE OF TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$250.00) FOR A VARIANCE OR A SPECIAL OR APPEAL OF A NON RESIDENTIAL USE.
