

MEETING OF THE HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS, WAS HELD THIS SECOND DAY OF OCTOBER NINETEEN SEVENTY ONE, AT THE TOWNSHIP BUILDING, LOCATED ON ROUTE 113 & DIAMOND STREET.

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER BY THE CHAIRMAN MR. HOCKMAN AT 9. 0'CLOCK A.M. MR. MOYER BEING DELAYED, MR HOCKMAN READ THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING, HELD SEPTEMBER 18, 1971.

MOTION BY MR. FRANKENFIELD TO ACCEPT MINUTES AS READ. MOTION SECONDED BY MR HOCKMAN. MOTIONBY MR .FRANKENFIELD TO PAY ALL BILLS. MOTION SECONDED BY MR. HOCKMAN.

PRESENT WERE LORRAINE CAMPBELL, INTELLINGENCER , MR. HORNER, NORTH PENN REPORTER, MR. CRESSMAN, ALLENTOWN MORNING CALL, MR GUBELMAN, MR. MOHR, MR. HEIBRICH, MR. MININGER, MR. PARKER, MR. HARTSHORNE, MR. RUBEL.

A SUGGESTION BY MR. HARTSHORNE TO THE SUPERVISORS, IF THEY WOULD CALL THE ENVIROMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY, AND NOTIFY THEM SMOKE AND ODOR, EMANATING FROM THE BLCK TOP PLANT OPERATED BY THE HORN QUARRY, LOCATED ON OLD BETHLEHEM ROAD AND QUARRY ROAD, AND IF WE COULD FILE AN INJUNCTION TO BE INCLUDED IN THE HEARING SCHEDULED FOR FRIDAY MORNING OCTOBER 8, 1971. IN COURT ROOM #4. SECRETARY TO CONSULT OUR SOLICITOR.

RECEIVED A PHONE A PHONE CALL, FROM MR BEDEIN, ENVIROMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY, STATING THAT THEY VISITED THE HORN QUARRY SITE, AND WOULD NOTIFY THEM OF THER VIOLATIONS, OF THE ENVIROMENTAL CODES. MR. BEDEIN WAS AT THE HEARING.

HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP PLANNING COMMISSION , REQUESTED A COPY OF THE BUCKS COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION, MODEL FLOOD PLAIN ORDINANCE , WE HAVE NOT RECEIVED A COPY. FINAL PLANS OF THE KOITZCH TRACT WERE SIGNED BY THE SUPERVISORS, 2 LOTS. LOCATED ON KEYSTONE DRIVE. A REVISION OF LOTS 11 & 12.

A RESOLUTION BY MR. FRANKENFIELD TO HAVE THE FIRM OG HARRIS OBREIN & HARRIS TO RESEARCH THE LAW, TO ANSWER THE COMPLAINT OF THE LEGAL AID SOCIETY. THIS FIRM WAS RECOMMENDED BY OUR SOLICITOR. *Motion approved*

MR. PARKER. A RESIDENT OF KEYSTONE DRIVE, ASKED THE SUPERVISORS, IF HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP HAD A FIRE CODE. WE DO NOT HAVE SUCH AN ORDINANCE.

A SUGGESTION BY THE HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP PLANNING COMMISSION, IF WE COULD REZONE AN AREA FOR LOW OR MIDDLE INCOME HOUSING. OUR SOLICITOR ADVISED, THAT WE DO NOT REZONE, FOR THIS TYPE OF HOUSING AT THE PRESENT TIME. UNTIL THE COURT ACTION AGAINST HILLTOWN TOWNSHIP BY THE LEGAL AID SOCIETY IS RESOLVED.

SECRETARY TO INFORM OUR SOLICITOR TO SCHEDULE A HEARING FOR BUSH BUILDERS, FOR REZONING THERE LAND ALONG HILLTOWN PIKE.

WE, SUPERVISORS ARE INVITED TO ATTEND , A MEETING WITH THE SILVERDALE BOROUGH COUNCIL OCTOBER 18, 1971. TO DISCUSS OUR MUTUAL SEWER PROBLEM.

AT THIS DATE , HIL TOWN TOWNSHIP , HAS NOT MADE A COMMITMENT TO ALLBRIGHT & FREIL, PERKASIE WATER & SEWER AUTHORITY ENGINEERS, AS TO THE AMOUNT OF GALLONS PER DAY THAT HILLTOWN MAY NEEDFOR TREATMENT.
