MEETING CALLED TO ORDER AT 9 O'CLOCK A.M. BY THE CHAIRMAN MR, HOCKMAN WITH THE SECRETARY READING THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING.

ON A MOTION BY MR FRANKENFIELD TO ACCEPT MINUTES AS READ. MOTION THEN WAS SECONDED BY MR HOCKMAN.

MOTION BY MR. FRANKENFIELD TO PAY ALL BILLS. MOTION SECONDED BY MR HOCKMAN.

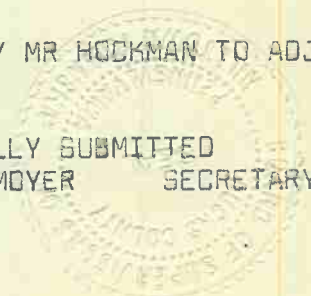
