MEETING CALLED TO ORDER BY THE CHAIRMAN MR. HOCKMAN, WITH ALL
SUPERVISORS PRESENT, CHIRMAN REQUESTED , MINUTES BE READ OF THE MEET-
ING HELD MARCH 27, 1971. MR BROWNING , TOOK EXCEPTION TO MINUTES AS READ,
AFTER SOME DISCUSSION, SUPERVISORS APPROVED MINUTES AS READ.

MOTION TO PAY ALL BILLS, BY MR. HOCKMAN, MOTION SECONDED BY MR.
FRANKENFIELD.

VISITORS PRESENT, MR KIDD QUAKERTOWN FREE PRESS REPORTER, MR CRESSMAN
MORNING CALL & NEWS- HERALD. MR HARING, MR. GUBELMAN, MR STOVER, MR. PHINNEY
MR MOHR, MR. BOOZ, MR GERMIA, MR. HEIDRICH, MR CONLIN, AND MR. & MRS LEE.

MR. BROWNING , MR HEATH, MR PHINNEY , PROTESTED THE REQUIREMENT
OF CURBING. THIS REQUIREMENT HAS BEEN IN OUR SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS, SINCE
IT WAS ENACTED DECEMBER 2, 1967. WE ARE AT THE PRESENT TIME ENFORCING THIS
SECTION (609).

MR HEATH ASKED IF THE SUPERVISORS HAD THE AUTHORITY TO ENFORCE
THE REQUIREMENT FOR CURBS, SUPERVISORS HAVE THE AUTHORITY, BEING THE
ELECTED OFFICIALS OF THE TOWNSHIP.

MR. HEATH WANTED IF THEY COULD HAVE THEIR OWN ENGINEER, INSTEAD
OF THE TOWNSHIP ENGINEER. DEVELOPERS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE COSTS OF THE
TOWNSHIP ENGINEER.

MR BROWNING ASKED THE CHAIRMAN , IF ANY ONE COMPLAINED TO HIM
ABOUT CURBING, MR. HOCKMAN STATED, ONLY YOU MR. BROWNING AND MR ENDSLOW.
WERE NOT IN FAVOR OF CURBING.

MR. GUBELMAN , STATED THAT ALL CITIZENS PRESENT AT THE MEETING
HELD MARCH 27, 1971 . WERE IN FAVOR OF INFORCING THIS REGULATION.

R.I.H.C. DEVELOPMENT PLANS WERE NOT SIGNED , SUBDIVISION REG-
ULATION 609 ARE REQUIRED.
