

The Regular Semi-Monthly Meeting of the Hilltown Township Board of Supervisors was held this day with all members present, Mr. Frankenfild, Presiding. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. Under old business, a letter from Smith, Mantel & Mims, the Township Solicitors was read confirming the legality of foreign fire ins. monies, to be paid only to the fire company within the township. A resolution was presented opposing ACT #442, the "Compulsary Wage Law", which upon a motion by Mr. Agan, seconded by Mr. Heckman, said resolution was adopted. Copies of this resolution to be sent to all county senators & legislators, Secy State Dept of Labor, Governor, and Secy of State Assn. of Township Supervisors. Mr. Stive, President of A.D.S. Developers, 1630 W. Thompson St, Phila, was present, requesting the Board waive the fifty (50.00) dollars needed for the Board of Adjustment Hearing. Mr. Stive, was making his request in behalf of the "Neighborhood Center", a Jewish Welfare Program. He was informed of the purpose of the Adjustment Board and why the Board cannot rule other than those laws which had been written in the zoning law. Application for proposed expenditures of state funds were filed & mailed to Mr. William Fell, Dept of Highways, Pottstown, Pa. Mr. Heckman, presented the proposed spec's for the new truck, the Board intends purchasing. The Secretary was instructed to advertise the soliciting of bids for said truck. General affairs of the township was discussed with no decisions at this time. There being no further business, meeting adjourned at 1:15 P.M., to meet again MAY 19, 1962 at the Township office, 9:00 A.M.
